Minutes

President Ken Stanly called the meeting to order at 6:31 p.m.

Minutes: MOTION I: Richard Roof moved that the Minutes be approved as printed in the online newsletter. Seconded and approved.

Financial Report: Treasurer Richard Roof distributed the financial report. He noted in April the Senior Club has revenues of \$895.00 and expenses of \$2,488.50. He noted the cost of insurance for liability and Directors and Officers insurance amounted to \$1,426.74. For fiscal year to date, he noted revenues of \$2,247.50 and expenses of \$3,602.68 for a negative cash flow of \$1,173.80.

MOTION II: George Reynolds moved to accept the Financial Report. Seconded and accepted.

MOTION III: Dan Everett moved to accept the Forensic Accountant's reconstruction of the financial records. Seconded and accepted.

DISCIPLINE CHAIR REPORTS: The year's match dates are on the website(Schedule). For more information on specific disciplines click on Disciplines.

High Power: Robert Cantrell stated that the next match would be this coming Saturday.

Small Bore: The weather at last weekend's match was a factor in the low turnout. There are a lot of our-of-state shooters and four or five local shooters that compete on a regular basis.

CONTINUING BUSINESS:

Agreement, Release, and Bill of Sale: Ken and Lynn McCutchen signed the Agreement, Release, and Bill of Sale document whereby the Club was released from all liability for range lead contamination in exchange for the Club's physical assets at its former leasehold. Accordingly the Club keeps the portion of its investment that was set aside to cover lead remediation costs. Lynn stated that while the agreement that the Club would have access to the range facilities and meeting room at no cost to the Club, this portion of the agreement expires on December 31, 2017. He stated that he was willing to renew such arrangement with the Club on an annual basis so long as he "could get along with the Club or its members."

Bylaws: Carolyn Roof stated that a cover letter was sent to members noting that the proposed bylaws were on the Club website. As there were no corrections, bylaws will be voted at the monthly meeting, July 17.

NEW BUSINESS:

Trap Club: Dan Everett discussed area interest in trap shooting and asked if the Club would sponsor a high school team. There were questions as to who would be part of the team, high school approval, coach, Club cost, and traps. PSSC and Juniors each own a trap; two are needed for a match. By general consensus, he was asked to look into the above questions and to report at the next meeting.

The next membership meeting will be Monday, June 19, 6:30 p.m. at the Community Center.
