March 9 Program to be presented by Ashley McDowell

Her goal in the future is to get the highest ranking possible in the sport of Hi-Power Rifle. Presently she has a rank of Master. Hi-Power Discipline chair Robert Cantrell says that she is one of the best Hi-Power shooters.

February 17 Program “Revolutionary War Uniforms, Accessories & Firearms”

presented by Dr. Brad Rankin, SAR Capt. Virgil McCracken Chapter President

Brad stated that most re-enactors start by wanting to learn about history and try to be as accurate as possible in clothing, accessories and firearms. His interest was the result of wanting to learn more about his ancestor, William Moffet.

Some of his uniforms were purchased and some accessories he made. The Militia were farmers and hunters wearing what they had and brought their own muskets with them, though not the best as those were confiscated for higher ranking personnel. The first layer of clothes was the work shirt they slept in, next layer a weskit, and then overcoat.

There were two different military groups in addition to the Militia: Continental under Washington who did not like the Militia as the members did not follow the ‘gentlemanly manner of fighting’ not were they good at standing and marching – they were hunters.



That was an advantage at the Battle of Bull Pen. The Colonists lined up with the sharpshooters in front, after they shot, they moved to the rear, exposing the militias who fired and scattered leaving the impression with the British that they were retreating. Instead, the British faced the Continental Army with rifles.

Once they fired, they would circle around, and the three-line attack would repeat. Why were muskets used? They were fast to shoot and clean. Rifles were more accurate but would gunk up, making the rifles useless.

Kentucky County(Virginia) did not have great battles, mostly skirmishes. Daniel Boone’s son was killed at Blue Licks. Graves and Crittenden also fought in the skirmishes. Most Kentuckians went north to fight and when finished, headed south. The Ohio River was considered the bloodiest river in the country due to the fighting back and forth.

Brad brought muskets along with historically accurate clothing, with a few exceptions.

At the Battle of Saratoga the French musket Charleville (.69 cal. 60” long) was used and it was that victory they brought the French into the war.

The Lancaster was also known as the Kentucky Long Rifle(54 cal., and 54” long). ‘Kentucky’ was considered the western part of the country and that term was applied to the rifle.
