President Ken Stanly called the meeting to order at 6:30p.

Minutes: MOTION I: Mike Jones moved to accept the minutes as published in the on-line newsletter. Seconded and accepted.

Financial Report: Treasurer Richard Roof reviewed the financial report. The Club net for September was \$291.96. Billings for law enforcement and security agencies that use Range #2 for training, will go out on Monday. The Club has had a positive cash flow for the year and the investment has shown some increase. The Trap Range has not been attended consistently and has lost money. Review of the books continues and beginning next month a copy of the monthly deposits and checks will be made available at the monthly meeting.

MOTION II: Mike Jones moved to accept the report. Seconded and accepted.

Continuing Business:

Benchrest: The last ARA match will be November 5. Benchrest will continue to shoot every second and fourth Tuesday until they decide to quit.
